and Testament

of James

Glick

Dec. 7

1819.

I James Glick of the County of Mercer & State of Kentucky being very weak of Body, but of sound and perfect memory, do make & ordain this to be my last will & Testament, thus bearing all

Witnes.

Item. I lend to my beloved wife Sarah Glick

during her life or widowhood the one half of my

land or plantation whereon I now live including

the dwelling & other houses together with all my

household & Kitchen furniture, & tools of husbandry

(our horses (white), the black horse bay mare, young

bay horse, & Gray mare, & head of cattle her choice

out of my stock of cattle, twenty hogs & twelve sheep

her choice out of my stock of hogs & sheep, also five

Negroes (white), Nelson, Nathan, Eliza, Nancy &

Susan, which said Negroes & other property are

to continue in the care & management of my wife

but the said Negroes are not to be removed with

out the State of Kentucky on any pretence what

ever, but my said wife may hire out said

Negroes if she thinks proper. It is clearly my

intention that all the property or profits arising

from that part of my land & plantation, the

labour my Negroes & other property which I

lend to my wife during her natural ^{life} or widow

hood as before mentioned, shall entirely be

ing to my wife & Subject to her disposal or use,

that at her death or marriage, the aforesaid

land or plantation, Negroes & other property

before mentioned shall return to my Estate

& be disposed of as hereafter to be mentioned.
