From Todd Ferry to Harrodsburg which he is now in possession of to him and his heirs for ever - Item I Give unto my daughter Lucy Brown one Negro boy name Ralph also one mare and two cows and calves which she now has in possession to her and her heirs for ever - Item I Give unto my son Thomas Munday the remainder of my Tract of Land now lying on lying on the North Side of the road leading from Todd's Ferry to Harrodsburg after the De. th of my wife also one horse which he hath now in possession also two cows and calves to be delivered to him when he should be of age to him and his heirs for ever - Item I Give unto my daughter Elizabeth Munday one Negro Girl named Winney also one Horse which shall be Valued to be worth twenty pounds also two cows and calves to her and her heirs for ever - Item I Give unto my son William Munday - James Munday and Reuben Munday all my Land in Washington County lying on the Rolling Fork of Salt River containing four hundred acres also another tract in Franklin County which I purchased of John Bennett containing one hundred twenty acres to be equally divided between them also that each of them shall have one horse apiece out of my Estate that shall be Valued to be worth £20. each also two cows and calves apiece when they shall come of age to them and their heirs for ever - Item I Give unto my daughter Polly Munday one Negro Boy name Gilbert also one Horse to be Valued at Twenty Pounds also two cows and calves to be delivered to her when she shall come of age or sooner if in case of Marriage to her and her heirs for ever - Item I Give unto my daughter Polly Munday one Young Negro to be purchased for her out of

my Estate if not raised To also one Horse Valued to be worth twenty Pounds also two cows and calves when she should come of age or marry to her and her heirs for ever - Item I Give unto my daughter Nancy Munday one Young Negro to be purchased out of my Estate if not raised also one Horse to be Valued to be worth twenty pounds also two cows and calves when she shall come of age or marry to her and her heirs for ever - Lastly I constitute an attaint Tho Sneed my son Harrison Munday and Scott Brown Executors of this my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this first day of July Eighteen hundred and Eighty and published in presence of -
