3. loved Wife and at her disposal at any time also the present crop of every kind to be left to her and for the support of the present family. It is my wish and desire that all my landed Estate shall be equally divided between my daughter Anna W. W. William W. W. Hanna W. W. Sam^l. W. W. and Polly W. W. Men to be appointed by the Court of this County to make the division equally in quantity and quality. My sons John and Rob^t. W. W. and my daughter Henry W. W. in I have heretofore given all the Land that I ever intended to them. To my daughter Hanna W. W. I give my negroe girl named Selvie to her and her heirs for ever I also give to my daughter Anna my young Black mare, The ballance of my personal and moveable Estate of every kind it is my wish and desire that it shall be equally divided between all my legal heirs. I do constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Hanna W. W. my Executors my sons John and Rob^t. W. W. my Executors to execute this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I sign my name this 6 day of June 1801.
