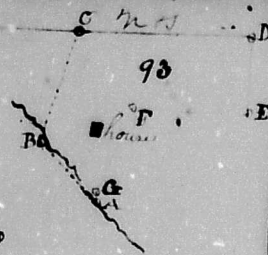

My Distance to an order of the Worshipful Court of St. Andrew County in the State of South Carolina in the case of William Brumfula Deceased his Widow in late Husband's land containing 93 acres including the Mountain tracts of the Decedent. Beginning at two Buck trees in Henry's Hammer line is a branch thence up the bank with its several Meanders the general course being N 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 72 poles to a Stony Locust thence N 81 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 97 poles to a Dogwood in the old line; thence N 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 152 poles to two Sugar trees and a Barb corner to Street thence N 88 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 67 poles to a Sugar tree corner to Richard Hope thence S 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 100 poles to a Stone corner to Henry Hammer thence S 83 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 77 poles to a Sugar tree & Beech corner to said Hammer thence N 88 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 10 poles the Beginning her corner County Sth E. Archibald Bell's Nov. 6th Court 1819 Wm. S. Sams. Esq.

I Fayette Roane of the County of Jefferson State of Kentucky do make ord am and declare this instrument to be my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills heretofore made by me I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth H. Roane all my Estate of every description both real and personal both in

possession and Expectancy; but if my wife should die before Mr. Sarah Hunt or my Daughter Sally Anna Roane, then and in that case my Estate as aforesaid to be equally divided between Mr. Sarah Hunt and my Daughter Sally Anna Roane I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth H. Roane my only and sole Executor without any kind of Responsibility to this my last will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 15th day of Sept^r 1816 Fayette Roane Esq.

In the name of God I James Allen of the County
 of Mercer & State of Kentucky being weak in
 Body but of perfect mind & memory do make
 this my last will & Testament. First it is my
 will and desire that all my just debts be paid
 & as regards the residue of Estate with which I
 am possessed. It is my will and desire that my
 Executor hereafter named collect such Estate
 real & personal which belongs to me in Virginia
 & appropriate so much of the same to the purchase
 of a piece of ^{land} in Kentucky at the selection &
 discretion of my Executor for my wife to live on
 during her life. It is further my will and desire
 that the personal property I may own & possess
 after my debts are satisfied remain in the use
 of my wife in such manner as my Executor
 may approve of for the support of my wife and
 Education of my children and after her death
 that the property be equally divided amongst
 my children hereafter named to wit, James
 Allen Jr. Isaac Allen Moses Allen John Allen

226 William Allen Archibald Allen & my daughter
 Eliza Vandavies Children making her children's
 portion should she have any equal to our several
 of my Estate. I do hereby nominate & appoint
 my friend Jolly S. Parish Executor to this my last
