I George Horine of Mercer County & State of Kentucky make this writing my last Will Testament I hereby appoint Jeph Hudd my Executor of this my Will I hereby direct that my estate be not appraised I hereby give to my son Henry P. Horine the tract of land whereon I now live containing one hundred & eighty acres after my youngest son becomes twenty one years old it is to be understood that Henry has no authority to dispose his mother during her widowhood of the place mentioned. All the balance of my land except the one hundred acres I sold to Wiley I give to my three sons George Napoleon & Nelson to be equally divided between them when Nelson becomes twenty one years old the last mentioned land to be rented until the time of division and the proceeds be thrown into one common stock for the support of the family then to be sold & divided between the three boys My Will is that the first \$500 payable on the sale of the mill be applied to my debt if required the remaining \$2500 to be divided equally between my five daughters; I hereby direct my horse shall be sold except three of the most useful kept for the use of the family the four best cows also reserved for the use of the family the Balance sold hark of my best hogs kept for the use of the family three Breeding sows and twelve shotz also reserved the balance of my hogs sold fifty Bushels of my present Crop of wheat to be reserved for the family

use the balance to be sold the Crop of Rye
to be sold together with the rest Corn due
Me this fall My will is that My Wife
• Nancy Hovins have the use of my dwell-
ing house together with the amount of

ing widow if she leaving the place
to be My son bearing by paying yearly

said sum within three Months after my
decease that my Executors make him my
title to the land within whom he now
lives otherwise to sell my title to the said
tract whom Higgings now lives and keep
for my estate the sum mentioned above
and pay the balance of any to G. W. Higgings the balance
my whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
