In the name of God Amen I Barant Reynardson of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being at this time weak in body but of perfect mind and memory do hereby ordain & establish this as my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others In the first place I commend my soul to God who gave it and my body to be decently buried by my executors to be hereafter named - 2^d It is my will that all my just debts be first paid and as I have this day sold my Mill and Land on Salt River to Garrett Vandyshe and Samuel Keller & Co. it is my will that my executors or any one of them shall have full power to convey the same agreeable to my bond & it is further my will that the Tract of Land I this day purchased from Garrett Vandyshe in part pay of my Mills together with my house hold & other

furniture as well as horses & cattle shall go to my beloved wife Anne during her natural life or widowhood and as to my hog and third of the same shall be my wife to support on and the other two thirds shall be equally divided between my four sons Isaac Jacob Henry & Abraham It is my further will that out of the money and bonds due me for my mill & other work which remains after my just debts are paid it shall be divided as follows my beloved wife is to have four hundred dollars to her own use for her support & to aid her in building a house to live in and the balance shall be divided amongst the children I have by her in the proportion of two thirds to the boys & one third to my daughter by her & their heirs respectively It is for this my will that at the death of my wife or her marriage that the land I this day bought of Garret Vandyshe containing about one hundred and fifty acres more or less be sold and the money arising from the sale thereof shall be equally divided amongst the children sons & daughters and their heirs that I have by her and it is my will that at her death or marriage aforesaid all the personal property hereby willed to her shall be sold and divided as last aforesaid named or my wife may give to any of my children during her life time such part of my personal property as she may choose they being accountable for the same out of their equal shares of the same at her death (whereas I have three children by a former wife who are already provided for and settled viz. Sly, Catherine and Barant It is my will that each of them receive from my indebtedness five dollars or demand when applied for in full of their claim on my estate. I am induced to do so because my present children aided me in procuring this property I have - It is my further will that my
