 First I give & devise all my debts are to be paid
 out of my estate. Secondly I give to my Son George
 Chesnut of my Daughter Catharine Nagley Decent
 my Son Nathaniel Nagley Sarah Nagley Catharine Nagley
 Henry Nagley Susanna Nagley, P. Marthas Nagley
 the sum of one hundred and twenty Dollars to be equally
 divided among them, share & share alike to be paid
 to them out of my estate. Also I give to my Son
 George Harris one hundred thirty acres of my far-
 lying land in the County of Mercer Ky. (the
 land is York of Shawingren as per Deed) to be laid off
 so as to include a proportional part of unimproved &
 unimproved land - the part that appertains to my
 son George is to be for his support & benefit to be
 appropriated to his use by my Executors as he may
 require and if my son George should die
 - or if he in this case my will is that his part
 shall be equally divided among my grandchildren
 descending from my Daughter Catharine Nagley
 my son Samuel Harris Also I give my son
 Samuel Harris twenty Dollars to be paid to him

We also report that we have inquired into
Examined into what Becchi the said John Hanna
is entitled to against the said Ward and are of
Opinion that his expenditures for board clothing
