 I Hugh Donagh of the County of Mercer and
 State of Kentucky being at this time in a feeble
 & weak state of health but of sound mind and memory, and
 feeling to mind the uncertainty of life, do make and
 constitute this as my last will and testament; I do
 recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body
 to the Earth, to be disposed of in a decent Christian
 burial at the discretion of my friends; and as to
 my worldly estate I have with a calm and peaceful
 mind bequeathed the same in this manner:
 I do give all my real estate and all the proceeds
 of it in the following manner:

First after all my just debts are paid I give & bequeath
 to my wife Susan the residue & remainder of
 my personal property and the use of my land
 estate during her natural life: and after her death
 I will and do give that my estate both real and
 personal shall be sold at public sale on such
 credit as my Executors may deem necessary for
 the best price that can be had, except my Pracey
 manor which is to be reserved for my daughter Nancy
 and the proceeds of the sale to be disposed of in the following
 manner: (To wit) To my son Paul Donaghy one
 Fifty Dollars in addition to what he has already

received from me for him and his heirs forever; to my
 son James Donaghy and his heirs forever I will and
 bequeath one dollar in addition to what he has already
 received of me; To my son Hugh Donaghy and his heirs
 forever I give and bequeath one dollar in addition to what
 he has already received of me; To my son John
 and Peter Donaghy I give I give and bequeath one
 dollar each to them and their heirs forever in addition
 to what they have already received of me; and to the
 Catholic Church I give and bequeath twenty dollars;
 and all the residue or remainder of the proceeds
 of sale as a love named I will and do give
 shall be divided between my four daughters Sarah
 Jackson late Susan Donaghy Elizabeth Donaghy
 Lydia Taylor late Lydia Donaghy and Nancy
 Donaghy share and share alike; and for the faithful
