 and declare this instrument to be my last will and tes-
 tament seeking no other. my will is that my farm and
 all my Land, and the whole of my personal estate be
 sold by my Executor at such rate as he may think proper
 and my Negro Boy Sy. who will be eighteen years of age
 in the month of October or November next be hired out
 by my Executor until he is twenty eight years of age &
 that my said Negro may not be sold into the hands of
 persons that might mis use him my will is that he
 be hired out privately by my Executor annually until
 he is twenty eight years of age at which time the said
 Negro is to have his freedom and all the proceeds of
 the hire of said Negro and the money arising from the
 sale of my estate together with the money that I during
 my life paying my just debts (which are but very few)
 to be equally divided among my brother and sister
 David & Maria Every and Elizabeth Every of Kanawha
 County Virginia Christina Every now Christina White
 as of South Carolina in the United District near the
 three forks of Saluda River except fifty dollars which I
 give to Elizabeth Taylor for her attention and trouble
 during my life and I nominate and appoint
 James Caldwell Executor to this my last will and tes-
 tament Witness my hand this 18th day of March
 1822
