part of the balance of the estate land, negroes &c.
& furniture the other property to be sold and
all his debts first paid and the balance of the
estate to be divided as follows Except that Polly
is to keep her land & Brattle and Lucy to have
one Sadella & Brattle of equal value his share
in what Elizabeth Polly Lucy and Nancy
all shall receive of his estate Equal as to
Cattle as they shall turn out. And it shall
the balance of the estate to be divided
equal amongst all his children Except
his son John to have two hundred dollars

Now for his Share than Either of the
 by it is also to be understood that John
 must have his schooling and that to be
 paid before the General Division is made
 like with the raising of John and Henry
 is. In my Experience and in that way
 all Justice and Equity to all the Children
 as far as possible is required
