In Attendance to an order of the Worshipful Court of the or County in favor this day assigned to James Eccles late widow of John Gant deceased her dower in her said deceased husband's land 133 1/2 acres including the Manors house & said Decedent & the farm on the East side of said river Beginning at her white walnuts and a Buckeye in the lower line of the tract on the East bank of the river thence East 116 poles to a white ash corner to James Wister's land thence South 170 poles to a large black ash and 133 1/2 acres small white ash thence West 120 poles to three Hickories at the mouth of a branch thence down the river with its several meadows to the Beginning together with one third part of the profits of the said land & estate during their continuance given under our hand this 18th day of January 1815
