Memory do hereby make & declare this my last will and
Testament in manner and form following -

Now I give to my beloved Wife Ann Harrod one half of my
tract of Land that she is now living and to be divided by
an East and West line so as to include my Dwelling house
and other necessary houses on her part I also give to my said
Wife all my negroes both male and female I also give to my said
Wife Ann Harrod one half of my said

such as horses, cattle, hogs, sheep &c all which land and
other property I give ^{and bequeath} to my said wife Ann
Harrod and her heirs forever. I am my wife and am
is that my Executors hereafter mentioned should discharge
all my ^{last} debts by the sale of all or any part of my lands or
my manor plantations. I am I give to my Daughter
Margaret Harrod all the rest & residue of my Estate both
Real & Personal including all my Lands, negroes, stock and
Debts owing me with all and every article that I am possessed
of that is not before I died all which land and other
property I give ^{and bequeath} to my said daughter Margaret
Harrod and her heirs forever. Lastly I constitute & appoint
my beloved Wife Ann Harrod Executor and William Moore
of Mercer County and John Harrod of Nelson County
Executors of this my last will hereby revoking all former
wills by me made and confirming this a line to be my last
will and Testament which I seal & publish and declare this
20th of November in the year of our Lord Christ 1791
