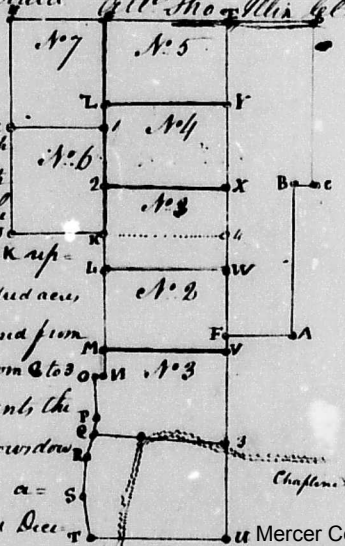

Explanation

The plat ABCDHI JV represents the tract of land on which Jesse Hale resided at his death containing about 950 acres. The plat K4DT and round to K represents the tract of two hundred acres which the decedent purchased from James H. Hiram. The line from Q to 3 binding on Chapline represents the line that divides the Widows dower from the land divided amongst the Heirs of said Decedent in the lower tract and the line VE representing the line dividing the Widows dower from the land amongst the Heirs in the upper tract. The several red lines show the dividing line between the several Heirs.
