Estate heard the bond of John Haley &c on which the
Decedent ~~James~~ lived & died near the mouth of Tuck river
and have let a part to Edmund Haley and
Thompson Thomas & Maria her wife later Maria
Haley children & adult sons of said Decedent Eighty
one acre of the said land designated in the Plat hereto
annexed by A 1st which said Eighty one acres we
consider to be equal in value to two fifths of the whole
tract

We have also Devised the Slaves of the said Decedent
as follows To Edmund Haley one negro woman
named Holl & her child Ben which said two negroes
we consider and adjudge to be worth \$1180.00
and may a negro worth in our opinion \$120.00
