hereafter mention

Lucy and her whole increase for her whole &
sole separate use during life and at her death
to her Children if any if not to her near blood
Heirs forever

3. Item. I leave to my niece Aley Gatllett
Stone Marner Marner and her ^{her} increase to her
whole & sole separate use during life and at her
death to her Children should she have any if
not to her near blood Heirs forever

4 Item. I give and bequeath to my Nephews Al-
bert & Henry Stone the money which will be
due me on Mr Kinners Death by a bond

hundred & fifty pounds bearing ~~late~~ interest from
the above date to Mr Kinners death; except twenty
dollars as left above to Helen Stone the balance of the
whole amount to be equally divided for the purpose
of buying each a Negro boy, horse saddle and bri-
dle the balance for pocket money. My own severe
sufferings at having my house servants bid
from me makes me secure those I have to leave
that my Nieces may not be exposed to the same
severe calamity.
