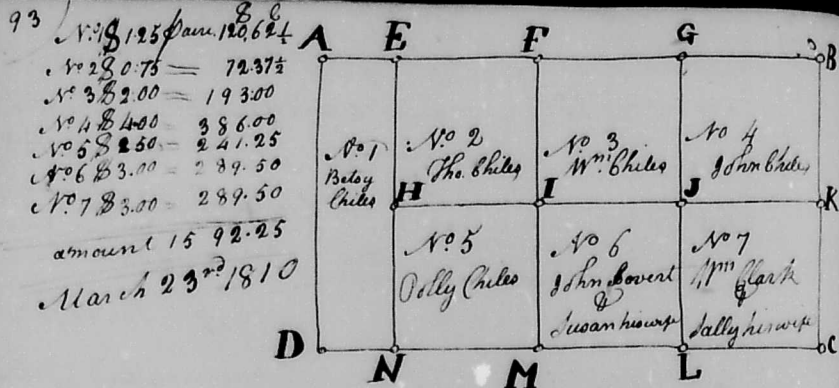




In obedience to an Order of the Worshippful Court of Mercer County we have divided and ^{valued} ~~valued~~ a certain Tract of land lying in Washington County containing 675 Acres among the Heirs of John Chiles deceased 1712. we divided and set a part by lot to Betsy Chiles Heir of said Decedent 96 1/2 Acres represented in Lot. No 1. Beginning at a walnut stump in Joseph Schoolings Yard; thence S 28° W 62 1/2 poles to a bush and ash corner to No 2 thence N 62° W 124 1/2 poles to two Beeches and a dogwood corner to No 5 thence N 28° E 62 1/2 poles to an ash and white Oak thence S 62° E 246 poles to the beginning which lot we valued at \$12.50 p. Acre the 96 1/2 Acres amounting to \$120.62 1/2 we allotted Thomas Chiles Joint Heir with the above the Lot No 2 containing 96 1/2 Acres Beginning at the letter E a bush and ash corner to No 4 thence N 62° W 124 poles to a bush and Sugar tree corner to No 3 thence S 28° W 124 1/2 poles to two Beeches & a sugar tree corner to No 3 & No 6 thence S 62° E 124 poles to three Beeches & a sugar tree on the old line; thence N 28° E 123 1/4 poles to the beginning which

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Let us value at 75 cents p. acre the 96 1/2 Acres amounting to \$72.37 1/2 we allotted and set a part to Wm. Chiles Joint Heir with the aforesaid Heirs the Lot No 3 containing 96 1/2 Acres Beginning at the letter F at three Beeches and a sugar tree corner to No 2 thence S 28° W 124 1/2 poles to two Beeches and a poplar corner to No 4 thence S 62° W 126 poles to a poplar Dogwood and Beech corner to No 4 & No 7 thence N 28° E 123 1/4 poles to two Beeches and a sugar tree corner to No 2. No 5 & No 6 thence S 62° E 126 poles to the beginning ^{which lot we valued at \$2.50 p. acre amounting} to \$193. We allotted and set a part to John Chiles Joint Heir with the above the Lot No 4 containing 96 1/2 Acres Beginning at the letter G two Beeches and a poplar corner to No 3 thence S 28° W 124 1/2 to a walnut in graves field thence S 62° W 126 poles to two Beeches corner to No 7 thence N 28° E 123 1/4 poles to a poplar & dogwood and Beech thence S 62° E 126 poles to the beginning which lot we valued at 4 Dollars p. Acre; amounting to \$386.
