In his last will

In the name of God Amen John McKinnay of the County of Mercer State of Kentucky being in my perfect mind but weak in body at this time and calling to mind the mortality of all living do ordain and Establish this writing to be my last will and Testament in the first place I do solemnly recommend my Soul into the hands of my Creator and any body to be buried decently at the

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discretion of my Executors but as to my Estate I give and bequeath it as follows viz to my son Charles McKinnay the tract of land on which now live containing one hundred and fifty acres & which I bought of Jeremiah Mule and wife to him and his heirs forever also my waggons and gear and his choice of four Horses of the five and the fifth to be sold to pay my Debt, also to the aforesaid Charles McKinnay all my farming utensils and all my stock of cattle Sheep and hogs to be divided equally between my wife Elanor McKinnay and my son Charles McKinnay and my wife Elanor McKinnay to have her maintenance out of my Estate during her lifetime if continuing in my name and my household furniture to be divided equally between my wife Elanor McKinnay my son Charles McKinnay my daughter Melby McKinnay and one two years old Roan Mare to Melby McKinnay and to my son John McKinnay Michael McKinnay Tanny Brown Ally Cole John Holloway Abbeas Lyrtin and Polly of or about \$900 and a quarter one dollar each to be paid by my Executors within six months after my death lastly I ordain my wife Elanor McKinnay my friend William Davidson to be the Executor of this my last Will and Testament Witness my hand and seal this 2^d day of December 1814
