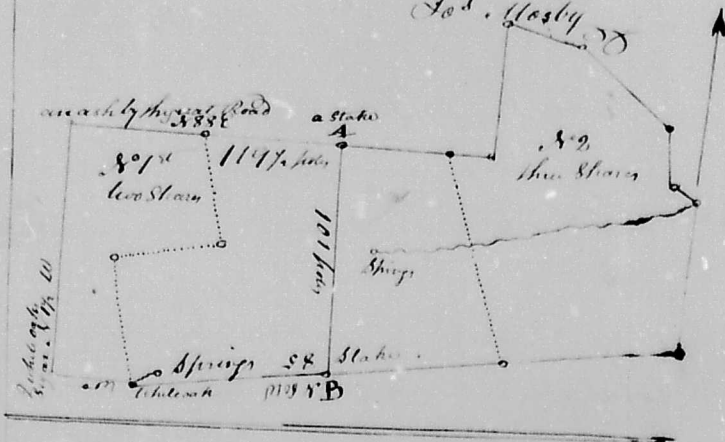

Division Directors Commissioners therein named have now
Estate heard the bond of John Haley &c on which the
Decedent ~~James~~ lived & died near the mouth of Tuck river
and have let a part to Edmund Haley and
Thompson Thomas & Maria his wife later Maria
Haley children & adult sons of said Decedent Eighty
one acre of the said land designated in the Plat hereto
annexed by A 1st which said Eighty one acres we
consider to be equal in value to two fifths of the whole
tract

We have also Devised the Slaves of the said Decedent
as follows To Edmund Haley one negro woman
named Holl & her child Ben which said two negroes
we consider and adjudge to be worth \$118 00
and may a negro worth in our opinion 75 00

He has also Decided and assigned to Thompson
 Thomas and Macey his wife the following
 Slaves to wit Dey, ^{who} we adjudge to be worth £80-0
 and Joshua at 20-0
 I've adjudge and value the residue of the Estate
 of Slaves left in the hand of the ^{Adminr} ~~Adminr~~ £45-0
 Given under our hands this day of 1810
