I John L. Officer of Mercer County being in a low state of health but of sound and disposing mind do make this my last will and followeth the Tenor: My will is that all the land that I possess in Mercer County be equally divided agreeable to value between my two sons Thomas and Matthew which I give to them and their heirs &c

forever I give to my daughter Sally the tract of land on Hickman whereon I formerly lived in Sepamun County to her and her heirs forever. My Will is that my Executors hereafter named sell the tract of land I purchased of Lindsey Mays on Hickmans Creek in Sepamun County in such manner as my Executors think best so as to meet and discharge my debts also my personal Estate I leave excepted and should those sales be found insufficient for the discharge of my debts my will is that in that case my Executors proceed to sell the tract of land which I have willed to my daughter Sally and apply the proceeds to the discharge of my debts but in the event of the sale of the last. You land land which is willed to my daughter my will is that my two sons equally share advanced to her to her so much as will make her proportion equal to either of them I give to my daughter Sally one woman's saddle it being the one formerly belonging to her Mother Also one Wooded White Counterpane & one patchwork bed quilt Now in the care of Wm. King of Sepamun to go as a part of her share when her brother shall have to make up to her in case his land shall be sold for the payment of my debts My will is that my Executors purchase of practicals from my sister. I give to her share of the land which comes to her from my father's Estate as I have purchased the shares of all the rest of my brothers and sisters

 rent of my land and any moneys that may

 as they marry or come of age viz to such of
 them as may live to arrive at either of those
 periods My will is that Buchner, Miller
 William Haskins & Thomas Allen be and
 I do hereby appointed as my Executors to this my
 last will My will is that my daughter
 Sally have all my late wife wares & furniture
 and my step father John Dooly have
 my own wearing apparel
