This last will of Peter Bonta of Mercer County, Pa. was produced into Court & proved by the oath of James Black a subscriber to the act of the Legislature, relating to the settlement of the Mercer estate, the said will was read & ordered to be recorded. Attest: Thos. Allen Clerk

As I am about to start to the North
I appoint James Warren and Davis
Knox my trusty friends to settle all
my business in case ^{that} I should not
return in the first thing I want
done is all my just Debt paid and
after that all my family to live to
gether until they are all of age &
to be well educated, and then all
to have an equal part, my wife
Peggy to have one thousand Dollars
more than a childy part If she should
marry she is only to have a childy
part, if to fore the youngest child becomes of
age hereunto I set my hand & seal
this 18th day of Oct. 1808

I dont want any of my children to be
bound out I mention this to my trusty
friends James Warren & Davis Knox
Given under my hand and seal to
to be my wish and will

Henry P Bonta who departed this life
on Tuesdaynd 19th Instant did name to us
as his wish with desire that his wife
Polly, should have his old bay mare,
saddle & Bridle Cupboard & Jew ware
and Earthen ware, one bed and furniture
one chest; and a small table so that she
might be enabled to keep house, & that
his land and all the rest of his estate
should be sold and that his wife should
have one third part of the money to do
what she pleased with and the balance
to go to his child Elizabeth & It was also
his special desire Joseph Morgan should
have the management of his estate
& settle all his business Given under
our hands the 21st July 1814
