

With my Contract with said Tertis. I purchased of James Deland a negro Girl for which I advanced \$400 the balance remains unpaid. I will bequeath the said Girl to my brother Richard. He has with her money upon his paying the balance of the purchase money. I purchased from James Newman three negroes which are yet in his possession for which I have advanced \$300. I will bequeath the same to the said Richard Boyce upon his complying with the Contract. I purchased a negro man from John King Jr. for which I have executed my note. I will bequeath the same to my said brother Richard Boyce upon his complying with the Contract. There was a Child laid to me by Lucy Irwin called & named. Solina. my will is that my two brothers Richard Boyce & Robert Boyce procure some place for it to live at & take it & give it two hundred Dollars each out of the money given by me to them. I will direct that my brother Richard Boyce appropriate two hundred dollars in educating Mary Boyce my Nephew son of my brother John Boyce. I will my interest in the young black Horse to my brother Richard Boyce. I will my large black horse (the oldest one) to my brother Robert Boyce. I will bequeath to my niece Solina Boyce daughter of my brother Richard Boyce one Negro Girl named Melly daughter of Annand to the said Solina. I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint my brothers Robert Boyce & Richard Boyce Executors of this my last Will & Testament.

my Children except. Nelly. Mory to which I
give her one dollar over and above what I have
all ready given her Lewis. Harlow is to have his
mother's part also I do appoint Constable and ensure
William. Mory and Lewis. Mory my sole Exec
utors of this my last will and Testament and I do
hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and
every other former wills and bequests by me in any
wise before named will^s and bequests^s ratifying
and confirming this and no other to be my last
will and Testament in Witness whereof I have here
unto set my hand and seal this fifth day of,

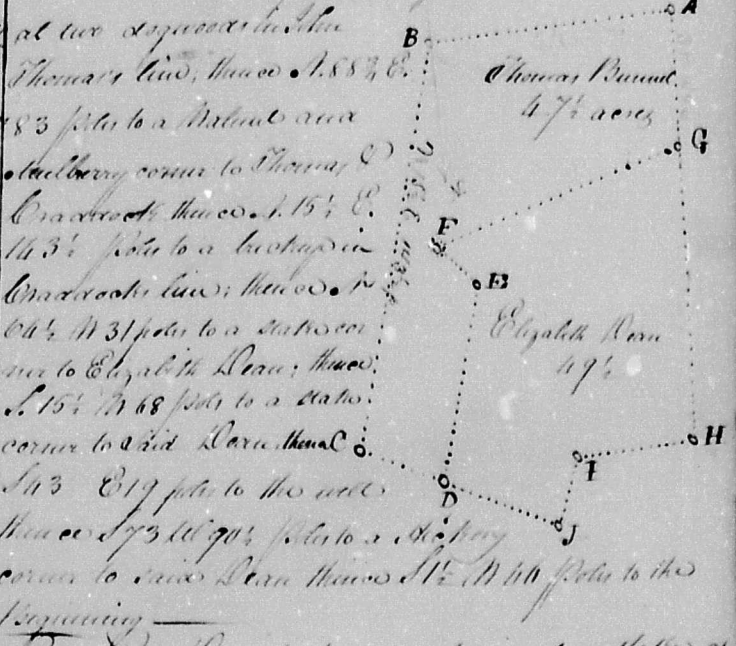
