I Give unto my wife Mary Adair a negro woman Rose I also give unto my said wife during her life all and every species of property own at her death the same is to pass into the hands of my Son John Adair to be held Intire for his two sons William Henry and John but should either of them die before they reach at the age of twenty one years then the whole of said property to belong to the other each or either of them to come to the age of twenty one years I give my said son John Adair is hereby permitted to exchange any or the whole of said property for negroes or Whiskey to him may appear most advantageous for the Benefit of my said grand sons William
