 are redeemed which my executors are required to do with as much
 expedition as possible after my death that my daughter Anna
 mah shall have one hundred & fifty acres of land bounded
 as follows Viz Beginning at a sugar tree corner to Isaac
 of land Isoto to William Mahon on the bank of salt river
 running up said river to the Mouth of the first branch be
