to my well beloved friend Michael Toth twenty
Dollars him I give to my sister Rebecca George
the sum of five pounds in Cash him I give unto
my brother Jos. Foster the sum of five pounds him
I give to my beloved friend Abraham Froman my
Hanging saddle and the Furniture of my estate both
Real & personal I give and I give unto my well
beloved friend & benefactor Jacob Froman of his heirs
forever whom I make constitute & appoint sole
Executor of this my last will & Testament in testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal

 Lowry do make this my last will and Testament
 Inprimis I give and bequeath to my three sons John
 James and Melvin Lowry my Two warrants entered
 to be divided between them quantity and quantity to
 them and their heirs for ever I give to my
 daughters Margaret Hannah Betty and Mary all
 my personal Estate whatever to be divided equally
 between them allowing the Bala which my wife

is now big to have an equal Part of my money
 if it should be a boy and if it should be a girl for
 her to have an equal Share of my personal Estate
 with the rest of my girls but if it should not be
 born alive then the Estate to remain to those
 to whom it is before given I give my Daughter
 Jane Todd five Shillings my wife I allow to have
 two hundred acres of my Land to live on where
 she may choose during her widow hood and to have
 her thirds of personal Estate of the rest to be
 divided between my Daughters Jane & Mary
 as above directed I give my daughter Jane
 To and the cow that is now in her possession &
 the Pair of headcloths that she has got also
 all Intentions made before signing &
 sealing Signed sealed published and culled
 by the testator to be his last Will and Testament
 in the presence of July 25 1781
