to him alone as I think his father has had a
sufficient part of my estate, in the next place
I give to my children, John Graves, Rice Graves
Levy Graves, Greenvil Graves Scott Graves Polly
Graves and Patsy Graves Levin Graves Each
twenty pounds of my Estate to be given them
as they be of age to receive it, my will also is
that the plantation whereon Samuel Sale now
lives be rented until my youngest child
becomes of age for the use of all my children
