My last will and testament that is to say
 Principally and first of all I give and
 Recommend my soul to God that gave it and
 my body I recommend to the earth to be
 buried as a decent Christian manner at the

 the General resurrection I shall receive the same
 again by mighty power of God and as
 touching such worldly Estate ^{which} it hath pleased
 God to bless me with in this life I give devise and
