In the Name of God Amen; I William Locke of the County of Mercer of State of Kentucky, being of a low State of Health, but of a perfect Mind and Memory do constitute and ordain this to be my Last Will and Testament, and First of all I resign my Body to the Ground and then my Soul to God who gave it in hopes of a future Happiness through Merits of the Redeemer, and as touching the worldly Estate which has Pleas'd God to bless me with, I do Dispose of as Follows (viz)

First I Give to my Beloved wife Elizabeth Locke the tracts of Land whereon I now Live and then I give to my Daughter Polly Locke one Negro Girl named Phillah and also I do Give two other Negroes

To my wife by the Name of Peg and Juley, and also I do Give to my Daughter Polly one Bond to the amount of one Hundred and Sixty Dollars, which Bond is now in the Hands of my Brother Frank to Collect, and for that money to be put to the use of buying of her a Negro Girl, and also I do Give to my wife one Riding Chaise and as for all my House-hold Furniture and all my Plantation tools together with my Stocke of all kinds I wish to continue in the Hands of my wife for the Support of her and my Daughter untill my Daughter shall come of age and then for to be Equally Divided between them and I also Give to John Gibson my Saddle together with all my Waring Clothes and also I give to my wife one Rifle gun and Finally I do appoint my wife Elizabeth and John Marshall Executors of this my Last will and Testament Disallowing all former wills made by me and confirming this to be my Last in Witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal.
