I now all men by these presents that I Mary Irvine of Mercer County and State of Kentucky being of Sound Mind and

Mimory but low in health and recollecting that it is appointed for all ~~men~~ Once to die do make this my last will and Testament here by revoking ~~all~~ and annulling all other Wills by me heretofore made To wit, In the first place I give my soul to God my Quaker and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner. In the second place I give and bequeath my Negro boy bill to my son in law George Caldwell in trust to be held by him in trust for the use and benefit of my son William I. Irvine. In the third place I give and bequeath my Negro girl young Hannah to my sons in law Joseph W. Dowell, Samuel W. Dowell & George Colwell in trust for the following purpose to wit That the said trustees shall dispose of the said Negro girl to the best Advantage and that out of the proceeds of said sale they shall pay the sum of One ~~thousand~~ ^{thousand} and sixty five dollars the balance which will be due for a tract of Land purchased by the said trustees in trust for my daughter Nancy McMorris and that they the said trustees shall pay Over to my said Daughter Nancy McMorris the balance of the price of said Negro girl Hannah if there should be any. In the fourth place it is my will and desire that after all my Just Debt are paid that the balance of my Estate not heretofore disposed of shall be paid to my son Robt Irvine. In the last place I appoint my

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two sons in Law, George Caldwell &
Joseph McDowell as Executors of this my
