

August 3. 1813 Agreeable to an order of the worshipful the County Court of Mercer bearing date May County Court 1812 Authorizing us as Commissioners to divide certain lands between Joseph Adams & Nathan Neelds heirs. We the undersigned accordingly met upon the premises and being first sworn proceeded to make the following division by proper Meas and bounds Viz.
