Whereas the Laws of this State have made ample provision for the Widow of deceased persons It is my will and desire that my Executors do have the same carried into full effect to my beloved wife Mary Gillespie and that she have the same during her natural life and at her decease to descend to and be possessed by my two sons James and David Gillespie to whom I do give and bequeath all the rest and residue of my Estate Real and personal of whatsoever kind or nature to be equally divided between the said James and David their heirs and assigns for ever to be possessed and enjoyed by my said sons as soon as they attain the age of Twenty one years.
