I Robert Kearney of the County of Mercer and State of Kentucky being in an firm State of health a present but in perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for his mercies to me, calling to mind the mortality of the body and that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and Testament first I recommend my soul to God that gave

it and my body to be buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors: And as touching such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me with. I order and dispose of in the manner and form following first that all my just debts be paid out of the whole of my estate. And the remainder to be ^{divided} in the manner and form following. That is to say to my well beloved wife Rebecca I give and bequeath the third of my real estate and the dwelling house (except that part of my land that I gave to my son John she shall have no claim upon it) and likewise one third of my personal estate and at her death my grandson George M. Duffee shall have to the value of one hundred Dollars out of her part and the remainder of her part to be disposed of at her death according to her pleasure, and to my Daughter Mary while she remains single shall have her living in the house as formerly and shall have a sufficient quantity of flax and hemp provided for her so that she may do something for herself and when she shall marry she shall be provided for and in all respects made equal to what my other Daughters got when they were married and over and above one feather bed and all the clothes belonging to one Cow and six Sheep and while she remains single there shall a horse kept for her when she shall have an occasion to ride out and my Books is not to be taken into the partition of my estate. but they are to be equally divided among all my Children viz John, George, Margaret, Elizabeth, Mary and Robert is to have my house Bible more than his share, and the same volume of school

192 family Bible ~~and~~ all my children shall have an equal right to them and my son Robert is to give to my grandson George ~~Wheeler~~ when he comes of age a horse worth Sixty Dollars and the remainder of my estate both real and personal I give and bequeath to my son Robert. I constitute and appoint ^{my} Sons John and Robert ~~McNamey~~ my only and sole executors of this my Last will and Testament in Witness hereof I set to my hand and affixed my seal this third day of April ~~in the year of our Lord~~ 1809
