Previously to my taking charge of his property a negro left him by his father will named Abraham had been killed by accident on the 1st of December 1822 I rented out his land for the ensuing year (viz) a part to Abraham Higgins and Robert Goafrey for \$175 Commonwealths Bank paper payable 1st January 1824 and to William D. Bohon & Jesse Jones another part for \$120 notes of the Commonwealths Bank payable at the same time on the same day I hired out his negro boy Summers to Elizabeth Dean and Robert Goafrey for \$36.50 cents Commonwealths paper payable 1st January 1824 and rented a small woodland pasture to William Dummer for \$10 Commonwealths paper payable at the same time all these contracts were to take effect from 1st January 1823 I endeavored to hire out his negro

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
