Samuel Graham of Mercer County State of Kentucky am
this writing to be my last will and testament in the first
place I desire that my estate be not Appraised I give my grand
son Samuel Graham son of my deceased son Joseph Graham
a Negro man being about twenty years old formerly called
Peter but now called Ned to the said Samuel and his heirs forever
upon these express conditions that in case he the said Samuel
shall die before he comes the age of twenty five years old and
shall have no lawful issue begotten of his body in
that case I desire the said negro to go to my children by my
first wife that is to say my ^{son} William Graham to be equally
divided between them or such of them as are living or their
heirs if any there be and in order to have an equal division
I wish the Negro hired from year to year & the money
divided as above unless they can agree & all the negro
and divide the money as above I give my son

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William Graham All Shilling I give my son James
Graham A Negro boy by the name of Lewis to him &
his heirs forever, I give my Daughter Kelly a negro girl
Elly to her and her heirs forever, I give my daughter
Nancy A negro girl named Patsy to her & her heirs
forever, my will and desire is that my daughter Kelly
have the bed and furniture which is now called number
the saddle called her (and a stout man called Villies
Man, & I also give my daughter Nancy A feather bed
& furniture a saddle called her also a bay young man
called Morgan jolly

My will and desire is that all the remainder of my
estate real & personal that is to say all the land I own
& the following negroes Hampton George Allen Peter
& Hanna Daughters of the former and also every other
thing I own in this world except what I have above given
I say my will and desire is that my loving wife Mary
Graham shall have full and complete possession
of my land & the last named five negroes also all the
rest of my personal estate not here before given
and with ^{the} estate my loving wife is to maintain ^{and train} my two
young sons, Young Washington Graham and Samuel

Graham and in case my loving wife shall become a
widow untill my son young Washington shall come to
the age of twenty five years old then my will and desire is that
my estate be equally divided in three equal parts, one third
to my loving wife one third to each of my young sons,
young Washington and Samuel and the one third which
my loving wife has at her death to be equally divided between
my two young sons I have full confidence in my loving
wife & do here and desire that she will take uncommon good
care of my two dear little sons my will and desire is
that in case my loving wife shall die Mary that
the provision I have made for her shall cease and in that
case she is to have one third of the personal

I state but not to have any of the negroes or land they are to be equally divided between my two young dear little sons young Washington and Samuel my will is that old negro Hannah be used well and hired to some good person and the money be paid in the hands of my loving wife for her to lay out to both the negroes in her disposition the plain meaning of the foregoing writing I desire may be considered my last will & testament finally and lastly I Appoint my loving wife Executrix and my friend George Claytown-Thompson executor to this my last will and writing I have put my hand and seal this 10th day may 1813

In Addition to asein Explanation of the foregoing will
I desire & direct that in case either of my little
sons Young Washington or Samuel shall die under age
and without children lawfully begotten that so much
as I have devised to him who may thus die shall go to
the other who may survive to him and his heirs forever
and whereas I have directed that a division of the
estate of Place in my Wife's hand as mentioned
in my will shall be made at the time that my
son young Washington shall come at the age of twenty one
years ~~the~~ Nowin case said young Washington

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I shoud die under ^{that} age my wish and direction an that
 the decision be not made until my youngest son
 Samuel shall be twenty five years old I wish and
 direct that no security shall be required of my wife
 when she shall Qualify as Executrix — —
 my wish and intention an that this Codicil shall be
 taken and considered as a part of my will as fully as if
 it were incorporated in the body of it I shoud therefore
 part of my will which speaks about my Negro
 Woman Hannah and I give the said negro Hannah
 to my two daughters Nelly & Nancy Graham
 but in case my daughters shall not continue to
 live together the said hana is to live with Nelly
 or Nancy & this power is given to said Hannah given
 under my hand and seal this 26th Day of May 1813
