body but of perfect mind and memory do constitute &
declare this to be my last will and testament In the
name of God Amen I do give and bequeath my soul to
God who gives it me and my body to the dust from whence
it came in full assurance that it will rise again at the
resurrection

As for the rest of my worldly goods and chattels I do be-
stow in the following manner

I Item I do give and bequeath to my wife Hannah her
bed and bedding besides her third

I Item To my son Joseph I do give Seven shillings

I Item I do give to my son in law John Hale Six shillings

I Item To Joseph Hale my son in law I do give one dollar

I Item And to my son Edward Willis I do give the planta-
tion I now live on and with the river survey as it measures
to the lower line of my two hundred acres and out Eastwardly
with the lines of said survey to include all the land in said
survey on the East side of the river. One Barshore Coulter
& flows uterils & Mattlock

I Item To my son John Willis I do give my upper survey
of two hundred acres on Deep Creek

I Item To my son in law Robert Caldwell I do give all
the land on the west side of Chapline in the survey of two
hundred acres which adjoins my plantation I now live on

I Item To my youngest daughter Oliver I do give one hundred acres
of land lying on Chapline fork below where the Trace now crosses
said fork and a good likely cow and calf

I Item All the rest I have to be equally Divided between
the four youngest Children namely Edward John Hannah
& Oliver

As for Decedents I have my wife Hannah and son
Edward Willis
