

First. I will that all my last debts and funeral expenses be punctually paid out of my estate.

Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved sister Ann. Edwards the sum of five hundred Dollars.

Item. To my brother Henry D. Edwards I give the sum of three hundred dollars and to my brother Hyezhiah D. Edwards the sum of two hundred dollars. when they shall become of lawful age, but the interest arising therefrom to be appropriated to the use of their education, or such other uses as may be found necessary, -

Item. I give my watch to my brother Joseph Edwards.

Item. I give all my religious books to my sister Ann Edwards; my historical and miscellaneous books to my brother Hyezhiah Edwards. and my classical books to John Christian. Item. I desire that one common Pocket Bible be given to each of my brothers as soon as they can be procured after my decease. -

Item. To the theological Seminary at Princeton in New Jersey under the care and management of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church. I give the sum of one hundred ^{dollars} for the assisting and furthering the design of that benevolent Institution in training up pious young men for the gospel ministry, to be used, and applied after the manner of similar donations.

Item. The balance of my estate of any I desire to be divided between my sister Ann. Edwards and my two brothers Henry D. Edwards.

and Hyezhiah D. Edwards in the same ratio and proportion with their respective legacies before mentioned. Item to my respected friend the Rev Thomas Cleland I give my set of magnum Bonum Razors. Lastly, I appoint Thomas Cleland and Samuel M. Eddy sole Executors, either jointly or separately of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 13th day of December 1815. Stanton Edwards
