In The Name of God Amos Stephen Ashby,
Senr of Mercer County and State of Kentucky
lying in Christian County and State aforesaid
being sick & very low though sound in memory
calling mind that all men once must
die first of all I Recommend my Soul to
God that gave it, and as to my worldly
affairs I do make Ordain and Constitute
this my last Will and Testament Revoking
all others heretofore made by me it is my
will & Desire that after all my Just Dts
are paid out of my moveable properties
that my wife have the balance as long
she lives and at her Death to be Equally
Divided between my sons John Stephen and
Euse also, Leave the plantation whereon my
wife now lives to her as long as she lives
& at her Death I will it to my son Euse
I also Leave my Negroes Christopher &
Dela to my wife as long as she lives
and at her Death to be Equally Divided
between my sons Daniel Absalom John
Stephen and Euse as for my young Negroes
Frederick Mitty Hanniah Leana Rachel James

Also One Negroes Menny sent by my son
Absalom to be Equally Divided between my sons
Daniel Ashby Absalom John Stephen and Euse
I also Leave unto my Daughter Letitia Nettie
thirty five pounds which thirty pounds she
has Received also I leave to my Daughter Mary
Simmons one Negroe Equal to the one which
I gave to my Daughter Anna Prather which
is to be both off their parts of the Negroes as for
my Military Lands I leave unto my Daughter
Letitia Mary and Anna three Hundred Acres
Each & if the Licks should make Salt I leave
one sixth part of the ^{benefit of the} salt Licks to my Daughter
as for the Balance of my Military Lands I leave
to be Equally Divided between my sons Daniel
Absalom John and Stephen Except Two hundred
Acres which I leave to my son Euse and one fifth part
of the Salt Licks if it will make Licks, I do appoint
my sons Daniel Ashby Absalom Ashby John Ashby
and Stephen Ashby my Lawful Executors, In
