My last Will and Testament in Manner and form following
I Impressee My Will and desire is that my Negro
Woman Lidea at my Decease shall become free and be
discharged from all further Service of any person
whatsoever and that she be thereof intitled to and enjoy
all the priviledges which other Free Negroes within
this State shall enjoy I also give the services of
Tom Abie Eve Jimmy Daniel & Dennis Six -
children of the said Lidea to My brother Joshua
Barbo to serve until the said Tom Daniel and Dennis
respectively attain the age of thirtyone years and the
said Abie Eve and Jimmy respectively attain the age
of twenty six years at which several periods the said
Tom Abie Eve Jimmy Daniel and Dennis shall become
Free and enjoy all rights and priviledges of Free Negroes
within this State, and it is my Will that if the said
Abie Eve or Jimmy shall have any increase during
their Infancy such increase shall not be deemed
Slaves and I further Decree that the owners or
possessors of the said Tom Abie Eve Jimmy Daniel
and Dennis shall cause them to be taught to
read and write and the said Tom Daniel and
Dennis to be taught as much of Arithmetic as
shall enable them to understand Accounts

to Benjamin Filds and his heirs forever one
one thousand acres of Land being one half of
a tract claimed in the Waters of - Panther
Creek Granted to me by patents bearing Date

I give and Devise to Elizabeth Barber
the Wife of my Brother Elias and to Mildred
Filds the Wife of Benjamin Filds and thousand
acres of Land being the residue of the tract
claimed on Panther Creek to them their heirs
and assigns forever -

I give and Devise to my brother John
Barber, Daniel Barber, William Barber, and
Elias Barber two thousand four hundred and
ninety four acres of land lying in the County of
Logan, thousand two hundred and nineteen
acres of which was Deeded to me by Philip Lyine
and Ealy his Wife the Eleventh day of July one
thousand seven hundred & ninety two and two
hundred and seventy five acres being the residue
of a tract of one thousand acres Granted to
me by patents bearing Date the Eighth day
of August one thousand seven hundred and
Eighty seven to them their heirs and assigns

forever to be Equally Divided -

All the residue of my Estate both Real and
personal I give and bequeath to my said brother
Joshua Barber to hold to him his heirs and
assigns forever, and in case of the Death of
Death of my said Brother Joshua without
Issue then all the Estate Left him shall
be Equally Divided between my said brothers
John, Daniel, William, and Elias in equal
proportions Except so much as may be necessary
to pay my just Debts which it is my Will
shall be paid by my said brother Joshua out of
the Estate Left him

Lastly I appoint my said Brother Joshua
Barber Executor to this my will hereby -
witnessing all Obedy, In Testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this fourth day of February one thousand
seven hundred and ninety seven
