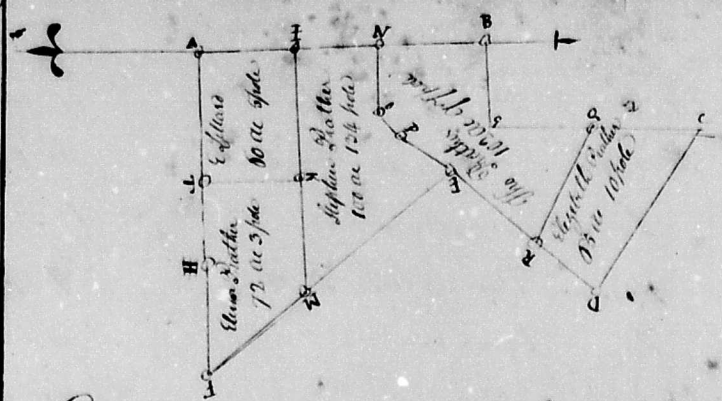

land lying on the south side of Chaplin on the upper end of
my possession. To my son Robert I do give and bequeath one
hundred and fifty acres of land adjoining first Brother James
on the north. To my son Samuel I do give and bequeath the
mention Hous with the remainder of my land adjoining it
at the death of my beloved wife. To each of my married
daughters I do give and bequeath two Sounes, To my daughter
Ann I give and bequeath one hors and saddle, two cows and
