Jonas Bingham my daughter Merriam my son
George Bingham my son Isaac Bingham my son John
to Bingham also my son John Bingham. I have also given
to three of my children who are dead what I intend. the
Estate I have I give to my daughter Martha W.
Bingham she being the only child that lives with
me shall my said daughter Martha W. die without
lawful issue ^{here to remain} of her body in that case
my will and desire is that what I have given
to be Equally divided between my three grand
daughters Eliza Watkins ^{Eliza W.} Emily Watkins or such of them as my he
live my will and desire is in case my daughter
Mary Fowler become a widow & chooses to live with
her sister Martha W. Bingham that she may do
as she sees fit of the Estate so far as to be wanted
I appoint my friends George C Thompson
John Barford my Executors to this my Last
will as witness I have put my hand & seal

In the name of God Amen I Deana Dean of
Mercer county and state of Kentucky being very
sick and weak in body but of perfect mind
and memory thanks be given unto God call-
ing to mind the mortality of my body &
knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die do make & ordain this my last will
& Testament that is to say principally and
first of all I give & recommend my soul
into the hand of Almighty God that gave
it and my body to the earth to be buried in
decent christian burial and a teaching man
worldly estate where with it has pleased God
to bless me in this life I give demise and dispose
of the same in the following manner &
form First I give & bequeath to my beloved
son John Dean a negro boy Lewis between
two & three years old also his Mother Aggy and
old mimmus to my beloved daughter Rozia Dean &
give & bequeath a negro girl by the name of
Mary and the one half of the ^{value} of my
old woman Molly also one bed & one cloth
Lorrey beloved son John Dean & one shorn

a negro girl by the name of Pulina & a negro boy by the name of Abram to my beloved daughter Ann Dean I give & bequeath a negro girl by the name of Susan and the half of the aliver of said woman Molly also over her bed clothes to my beloved grand child Thomas Dean & Mary Dean children of my beloved daughter Milly Dean I give and bequeath a negro child by the name of Isaac which my son John Dean is to keep until my grand son Tho^d Dean becomes twenty one years of age in consequence of my giving him thirteen then after my just debts are fully paid it is my will that my stock of cattle be laid off in 5 equal lots and divide among the above named legatees then the residue of my horses hogs sheep & house hold & kitchen furniture forming utensils &c to be put into five equal lots as possible & divided also amongst the above named legatees and to my be loved daughter Rebekah Bonnell I give and bequeath Eight dollars to be paid out of the above last named property also the next child that the above named woman gives may have so soon as it may be weaned from the breast the witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this eleventh day of June 1821 one thousand eight hundred and twenty two A.D. the words do murder hogs sheep interlined before signed Diana X Dean
