 Threlkeld Daughters of my Brother Henry Threlkeld
 for the Depreciation of the Paper money as my
 being Guardian to them & if they are satisfied with
 that sum then it is to be paid to them in twelve
 Months after my decease if not satisfied then it
 is not to be paid them and at that if it being so they
 are to give Receipt lastly I appointed my wife Nelly
