In the Name of God Amen 3 November the 20th 1796
 I Thomas Turpin of Mercer County & State of Kentucky
 Bring Very aged and in a Low State of Health But full
 myself in sound memory and perfect understanding
 and calling to mind the uncertainty of Life & frailty
 of Human Nature think it necessary to make this
 my last will and Testament in the first place I
 recommend my Soul to God who gave it & my Body
 to be buried in a Decent manner at the Discretion
 of my friends and my Estate to be Distributed as follows
 to wit I give unto my son Edmund Turpin and
 his Heirs forever A Negro named Mat which he
 has now in possession Also four hundred Acres of
 Land which he now lives with purpose
 Him I give my son Josiah Turpin one Negro
 fellow named North who he has now in possession
 also Two hundred Acres of Land by third choice & this
 Heirs forever when he lives
 I am I give to my son Jeremiah Turpin one Negro
 fellow named Atlas at the Death of my beloved
 Wife also at my Death one filth bed and furniture
 & one two year old Bay colt to him and his Heirs forever
 and two hundred Acres of Land by second choice and of
 a third of land lying in Tennessee State in Robertson
 County I am I give unto my son Thomas Turpin
 & his Heirs forever two hundred Acres of land being
 two thirds of a thousand Acres of land lying in the State

of Turpin and County of Robinson and one fifth
Bed and furniture and Negroes fellow named
Jack at the Decease of my beloved wife also one
fifth Bed and furniture at her Decease -

I am I Give unto my Beloved Wife the land &
plantation wherein I now live containing one
hundred and Twenty five Acres to it more or less
and Six head of Cattle Six head of Sheep and three
head of horses and nine head of hogs and the household
furniture and plantation working tools & Crop of corn
wheat & so forth & - Negroes to the care of my son
Jeremiah Turpin during her life -

I am I Give to my son Jeremiah Turpin his heirs
forever one Negro fellow named arts. and the
balance of the Stock & Increase thereof that
I had her During her life to him and his heirs
forever and Lastly I do Appoint my son Jeremiah
Turpin and my Wife Annula Turpin Executors to
this my last will and Testament
