Item I further give and bequeath to my two Sisters Darcus and Sarah, one hundred Acres of Land likewise in the Illinois grant number Seventy three. Item I further give and bequeath to Daniel Morfels three orphan Children begot by my sister Mary Sixty six pounds two shillings due me by Ann Harrod as will appear by memorandum of agreement now in the hands of Philip Fulkerson. Item I further give and bequeath to Ann Harrod as many of my stock of sheep (now on her plantation) as she may take together with as many of Hogs as she may take (on the said plantation) together with two ploughs. Item I further give to my Brother Aaron Moore all the remaining part of my real estate together with my personal estate. And lastly I appoint my brother Aaron Moore and Ann Harrod my Executors, Witness my hand and seal this 26th of March and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two
