The last will & testament of Robert Armstrong of the County of Mercer and State of Kentucky this Eight day of September one thousand eight hundred & fourteen Being in a low state of health but sound in judgment

1st Recommending my soul to God from whence it proceeded & my body to the dust from whence it was taken 2^d that my Executors shall out of my Estate cause my body to be decently buried 3^d that they shall cause all my just debts to be paid out of my Estate 4th that whomever my eldest daughter Pricilla and my eldest son William has each of them received a horse from me Estimated at fifty dollars each & that the rest of my children viz) Alexandra Joseph John Lucretia & Nancy James & Prudence from and after they are the age of sixteen years shall be liable to receive in property an apportion amount to Pricilla & William of the property may be thought proper to be spared from the support of the family 5th the balance of my Estate I leave to my beloved wife Mary Armstrong for the support of her & present family during her widowhood or the children is of age & in case of marriage or the children at coming at the lawful age it is my will that my wife have the Manse house & the living of the plantation during his natural life at which time my lands & property to be equally divided between my sons William Alexander Joseph John & James by Negroes my own and his offspring I leave to my beloved wife to dispose of as she may think proper And whomever under present circumstances it may be that my Executors may be cautious for money in consequence of a disputed tract of land lying down salt run disputed by a old feud in case of which it is my will that my Executors do this

hereby authorized to lay off & sell & bid as much of my home tract of land as will meet the demand to be laid off along the boundary of my survey & lastly I appoint my beloved wife Mary Armstrong Executor & the Clerk of the County of Mercer my Executor (mine) Signe & sealed in presence of us Robert Armstrong on the day and year before mentioned
