 renger of the Town of Danville in the County of Mer-
 ces and State of Kentucky do make this my
 last Will and Testament in manner and form
 following. I'mprimis. It is my will and de-
 sire that all my Just debts be paid by my Execu-
 tors hereafter named out of my Estate personal.
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Christina
 and Catharina Parringer one hundred and fifty
 dollars each. I give Polly Daughter to my wife
 one dollar and no more. My Wife Elizabeth
 Parringer having eloped from me without Just
 cause and thereby forfeited any right she might
 otherwise have had to a part of my Estate It is my
 will that she take none of it except one dollar
 which is more than she deserves at my hands. —
 I give and demise to my son John Parringer the
 residue of my estate whether real mixed or person-
 al to him and his heirs and assigns forever.
 And lastly I do appoint my Friend Henry Ort-
 hris and Josiah Barber Executors to this my
 last will and Testament and charge them with the
 payment of my debts and the Special legacies
 hereinafter given out of my Personal Estate hereby making
 all former wills In writing whereby I have heretofore
 made void and of no effect. In witness whereof I have here-
