the State of Kentucky being in a state of
sound mind and memory and considering my
advanced state in years and the certainty
of death and the uncertainty of the time
thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly
affairs and thereby be the better prepared to
leave this world when it shall please God
to call me home. I do therefore make and
publish this my last will and Testament
in manner and form following that is
to say first and principally I commit
my soul into the hands of Allmighty
God and my body to the earth to be

decently buried at the discretion of my
Executor hereafter mentioned and after
my just debts and burial expences are paid
I desire and bequeath as follows I give
I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas
Davis Junior legal Heir one negro Girl
named Beck aged fourteen years its my will
and desire that said Negro Beck and all
her offspring shall be set free from all
bondage at forty years of age.
I give and bequeath unto my son
Lamack Davis one negro Girl named
Maryam aged Eighteen its my Will
and desire that the above named Maryam
and all her offspring shall be free at the
age of Forty. I also give and bequeath
unto my son Lamack Davis one feather
which he is to have
bed, when called for. I give &
bequeath unto my daughter Eleanor
Davis one negro Boy named George aged
five years and one negro Girl named
Mary aged three years; and one female

a negro boy by the name of Ben, one
Gray horse, six sheep, one red heifer,
one pied cow, one red steer four
years old, one cherry chest, ten pewter
plates, one pewter quart, one Iron
wedge, three weeding hoes, one white
heifer, sixty three dollars and thirty
three Cents Cash, and twenty one doll
in bonds and eight dollars worth of
hogs, To Philip Woods, thirty four
pounds in bonds. To Haley Woods,
one fifth part of a negro boy by
the name of Ben, one year old 11
years old, six sheep, one black &
white Cow, and bells, one red steer

Cow, one white heifer, one red
and calf, one speckled heifer, one black
heifer, two yearlings, one red and white
steer, one walnut table, six pewter
bacons, three pewter plates, dishes the
half of a large. Barbecue plough, one
Iron tooth Harrow, two trap sithes, in
notes twenty dollars, and Cash sixty three
dollars and thirty three Cents and eight
dollars worth of Hogs. To Peggy Woods,
one fifth part of a negro boy by the name
of Ben, the half of the still and tubs, and
mould Kettle, four sheep, one red Cow,
one red and white steer, three years
old, one Black and white steer three
years old one red and white Cow, three
yearlings, one Cow and hocks, one large
Kettle, one pot and hocks, one pair
stillions, two trap sithes, eight dollars
worth of hogs twenty dollars in notes &
sixty three dollars and thirty three Cents
in Cash. To Susanna Woods, one
fifth part of a negro boy by the name
of

red, and white heifer, one pied
steer, one Oxen and heifer, one -
mutton, one leg chain, and mustel,
three sickles, three screw augers, and
shovel plough, and Elwin Egg, dollar
worth of hogs, twenty dollars in notes
and sixty three dollars and thirty -
three cents in Cash, and To Nancy -
Wood, one fifth part of a negro -
boy by the name of Ben, and

four chains, one glass Hatchet, one
cedar post, one frying pan, one small
kettle, one shovel plough, one pied
heifer, eight dollars worth of hogs,
twenty dollars in notes, and sixty -
three dollars, and thirty three cents
