the state of Kentucky being in a state of
sound mind and memory and considering my
advanced state in years and the certainty
of death and the uncertainty of the time
thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly
affairs and thereby be the better prepared to
leave this world when it shall please God
to call me hence. I do therefore make and
publish this my last will and Testament
in manner and form following that is
to say first and principally I commit
my soul into the hands of Almighty
God and my body to the earth where

dearly buried at the discretion of my
Executor hereafter mentioned and after
my last debts and burial expenses are paid
I desire and bequeath as follows Item
I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas
Davis Senior legal Heirs one Negro Girl
named Beck aged fourteen years to my will
and desire that said Negro Beck and all
her offspring shall be set free from all
bondage at forty years of age.
Item I give and bequeath unto my son
Lamach Davis one Negro Girl named
Maryam aged Eighteen to my Will
and desire that the above named Maryam
and all her offspring shall be free at the
age of Forty. I also give and bequeath
unto my son Lamach Davis one feather

Wools bearing date July First 1804
we have proceeded to divide the Estate
of Christopher Wools Deceased among
the Heirs and Representatives of the
said deceased in the following manner to wit

To Elizabeth Wools widow of Christopher Wools deceased One fifth part of a negro boy by the name of Ben, one gray horse, six sheep, one red heifer, one pied cow, one red steer four years old, one cherry chest, ten pewter plates, one pewter quawl, one iron wedge, three weeding hoes, one white heifer, sixty three dollars and thirty three cents cash, and twenty one dollars in bonds and eight dollars worth of hogs, To Philip Wools, thirty four pounds in bonds, To Kaley Wools, one fifth part of a negro boy by the name of Ben, one mare 11 years old, six sheep, one black & white cow and bell, one red steer

one, one white heifer, one red steer and calf, one speckled heifer, one black heifer, two yearlings, one red and white steer, one walnut table, one pair of
barons, three pewter plates, also the
half of a large Borehorne plough, one
iron tooth Harrow, two grape sithes, in
value twenty dollars, and Cash sixty three
dollars and thirty three cents and eight
dollars worth of hogs, To Peggy Wools,
one fifth part of a negro boy by the name
of Ben, the half of the still and tubs, and
one white Kettle, four sheep, one red cow,
one red and white steer, three years
old, one black and white steer three
years old, one red and white cow, three
yearlings, one (cow) and hooks, one large
Kettle, one gall and hooks (one pair)
stilliards, two grape sithes, eight dollars
worth of hogs twenty dollars in bonds, &
sixty three dollars and thirty three cents
in Cash, To Susanna Wools, one
fifth part of a negro boy, by the name

of Ben, and Lucy Pitty, three years old, four sheep, one white Cow, one red Bull, two red heifers, one black and white steer, one iron plow, one pair of hoes, one water pail, three sickles, one hoe, the half of a longs, Barcheans, plough, eight dollars worth of hogs, twenty dollars in notes and sixty three dollars and thirty three cents in Cash. To Daniel Woods. -

one Bay horse, three years old, one black horse, the half of a stall, tubs, and a black kettle, four sheep, one red Cow, one speckled Cow, one red and white heifer, one pick steer, one Oxen and hoes, one - mallet, one lag chain, one mallet, three sickles, three screw augers, one shovel plough, and eleven 'big' dollars worth of Hogs, twenty dollars in notes and sixty three dollars and thirty three cents in Cash, and to Nancy Woods, one fifth part of a negro boy by the name of Ben, one

gray horse seven years old, four dollars for Chancery, one glass Heickel Box, cedar point, one frying pan, one small kettle, one shovel plough, one pick, eight dollars worth of Hogs, twenty dollars in notes, and sixty three dollars, and thirty three cents in Cash. The foregoing division was made by the heirs and representatives of the estate of Christopher Woods, deceased, they being all of law full age, and consented to the foregoing division - before us, signed under our hands, this 11th day of August 1801.
