very sick and weak, but of perfect mind and
memory, thanks be given unto GOD, calling
unto mind the mortality of my body, and know-
ing that it is appointed for all men once to
die, do make and Ordain this my last
Will and Testament. That is to say principally
and first of all I give and recommend my
soul into the hand of Almighty GOD that
give it and my body I recommend to the
Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial
at the discretion of my Executors nothing
doubting but at the general resurrection
I shall receive the same again, by the
Almighty power of GOD And as touching

such worldly Estate wherewith it
hath pleased God to bless me in this
life. I give devise and dispose of the
same in the following manner I find
first. I give and bequeath to Lucy my
dearly beloved wife all my cattle
Hogs, and horses carpenters & farming
tools, together with all my household
furniture and fifty acres of land to
include the plantations where I live -
that is to say to live on for her life
time, at her death the said fifty acres
of land to be divided equally between
my three youngest daughters ~~when~~
they become of age namely Deborah
Lucy and Elizabeth. Also I give
to my well beloved daughters Nancy,
Polly, and Eliza each one and one
out of the above mentioned stall of
cattle. Also I bequeath to my three
sons Stephen, Japh. & David five
hundred acres of land on Sandy. Also
I appoint my ~~wife~~ ^{wife} Lucy and my
son Stephen my Executors of this
my last will and Testament, And

do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and
disannul, all and every other former Testa-
ments wills, and legacies, bequests and
Executors by me in anywise before ~~now~~
willed or bequeathed. Ratifying and Confirming
this and no other to be my last will
and Testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal the
nineteenth day of August in the year
of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred
and One. Signed sealed published pronoun-
ced and declared by the said David England
as his last will and Testament in
