my last will and Testament in manner
and form following to wit
Item Reserving to my loving wife Sarah
Johnson one third part of my Land and
plantation containing one hundred Acres
during her natural Life, I hereby declare
that at my Son, Will Johnson, coming
of Age my Land be divided in the
most convenient manner into three Lots
one to contain forty Acres and the others
thirty each and I give and bequeath to my
Son Abel Johnson the forty Acre Lot to

my Son Nathan Johnson one of the
Heirs of Ase. Lots and to my Son Kimball
Johnson the said remaining Lot and that
each have possession at their coming of age
yet so as not to interrupt my loving wife in
her widow

Item I hereby direct, that at my my
period my loving wife shall then &
last my Black Colt shall be sold
and out of the money so arising, I give
and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy
Johnson to be to her in Hand paid thirty
Dollars, and to my Daughter Katharine
