 such Worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God
 to bless me in this life I give Devise and dispose

 Mary Alison one Gray Horse Also one pair of
 fifteen Shillings in Cash And the Remainder
 of my Estate both Real and Personal I
 leave to my beloved wife Elizabeth Sanson
 so long as she shall live and after her death
 to be given to my beloved Son Samuel Alison
 And I do hereby disannul and Revoke all and
 every other Will or Wills by me here before made
 or Executed and Lastly I constitute and appoint
 my beloved wife Elizabeth Sanson my

 probate thereof in due form giving Security Wherein
 upon she together with Thomas Almonde her
 Security Bind and into and acknowledged their
 and in the formality of one Thousand pounds
 conditioned as the Law Directs Liberty being granted
 to the other Executor therein named to serve in the
