Being Henry Rings of Montgomery County and Commonwealth of Kentucky being male in body, of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, revoking all other by me formerly made therefore my will is that after my decease that my Body shall be decently buried at the direction of my Executors also my Just Debts of what ever nature they be and funeral Charges be punctually paid and settled to be raised out of my Estate and after the performance of the above as follows I give and bequeath unto my son Peter Rings all my tract with the poles, also one slave man and an equal part of all my Estate of ^{both} Real and

and personal with unto my sons hereafter mentioned, I give and bequeath unto my son Cornelius Rings one feather Bed and Bedding, I give and bequeath unto my son John Rings one hundred Dollars to be paid out of money due me that is provided he should ever come to the Kentucky Country, And if in case he should not come to be equally divided among the Rest of my sons here and hereafter mentioned, and lastly as to all the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate both real and personal goods and Chattels of whatever kind and nature forever I give and bequeath unto my sons I give Rings Samuel Rings Cornelius Rings and Joseph Rings to be equally divided among them Beleave of what have been before bequeathed and given and lastly I constitute and appoint my son Peter Rings and John McIntire to be my Executors both of Montgomery County of this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day
